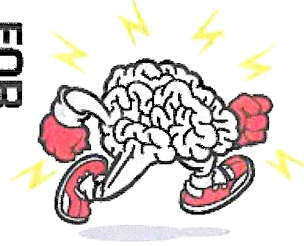


# THE JOGGIN FOR NOGGIN
